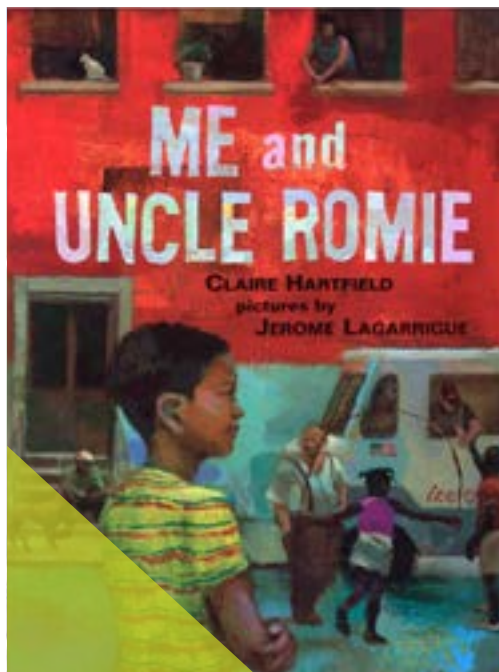
## Self-Taught Artists:

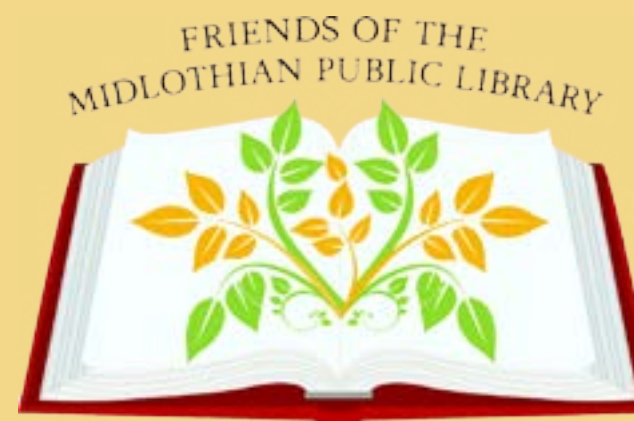
