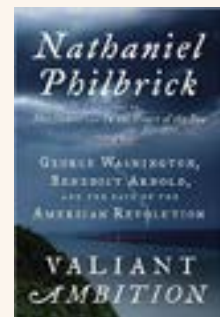

Bring the bright colors of Spring inside, and enjoy coloring with other adults. This is a fun and relaxing pastime. Please register.

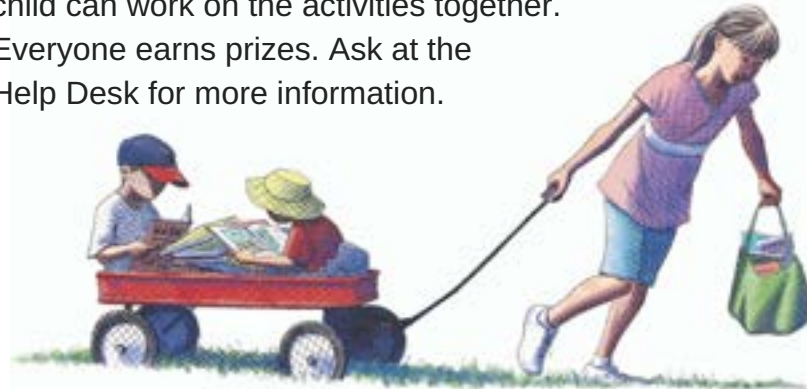

Wednesdays, May 11 & 25, 3:30-5:00 pm

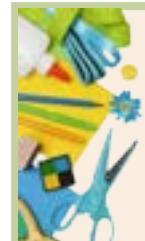
